# Tippy Toes Baby Blanket Knitting Pattern

This blanket uses a simple 4-row repeat that creates a subtle textured stripe, like little footsteps across the fabric. It's framed by garter stitch borders for a clean finish.

Skill level: Easy

Finished size: Approx. 22 x 28" (stroller blanket)

Yarn: Worsted weight, approx. 600 yards

Needles: US Size 8 (5.0 mm) circular needles, 32" cable length recommended

Gauge: Approx. 4.5 stitches per inch in stockinette stitch (not crucial)

#### Miscellaneous

Tapestry Needle Stitch Markers (2)

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#### **Stitch Dictionary**

K - Knit P - Purl RS - Right side WS - Wrong side

#### Notes

Odd rows are the right side of the blanket and even rows are the wrong side. It can be helpful to attach a clip to the front side of the blanket to help keep track of the front of the blanket vs. the back. Use your own creativity by choosing different colors at your own discretion at the beginning of any Row 1 of the 4 row repeat.

### Instructions

#### **Bottom Border:**

With worsted weight yarn and size US 8 needles: Cast on 100 stitches (I prefer the long tail cast on)

Knit 12 rows

On the last row, as you knit it, place a marker after the first 6 stitches and before the last 6 stitches

#### **Body of Blanket**

#### 4 Row Repeat:

Row 1 (RS): K6, \*k3, p1\* repeat to last 6 stitches, K6

Row 2 (WS): K6, \*k1, p3\* repeat to last 6 stitches, K6

Row 3 (RS): Knit across

Row 4 (WS): Knit across

Repeat rows 1 through 4 until blanket measures approximately 26", ending on Row 2.

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### **Top Border:**

Knit 12 rows

Bind off with a stretchy bind off method (see instructions below) and weave in ends.

### **Stretchy Method of Binding Off**

Knit the first 2 stitches.

Insert the left needle into the 2 stitches on the right needle and knit them together.

With one stitch on the needle, knit the next stitch, and then knit these 2 stitches together.

Continue this until all stitches are off your needles.

Cut the yarn, pull through the last loop.
